GMC's Extends and Street Outreach programs continue to broaden our reach of service. While our Drop-In Center continues to offer shower, laundry, mail, and meal services through physical distancing, GMC's Outreach Team, led by Gabi Peete, goes out into the community to meet people where they are. GMC Extends, led by Sabrina Burrell, serves dozens of guest every Monday through Friday evening, providing them with hot meals and warming kits to help fight the cold weather.
